

Yamaha RD50M: Ultra-light and Ultra-stylish

Everything that has made Yamaha the world's leader in sporting motorcycle has gone into making the RD50M the undisputed king of the ultra-lightweights.

Looks, style, and the refinement of Yamaha's unique race-bred technology have produced in the RD50 the sleekest, snappiest machine in its class.


The neat and punchy single-cylinder power unit shares the engineering features of the bigger Yamaha

sports two-strokes. Torque Induction produces positive combustion and eliminates blowback; throttle-operated Autolube lubrication whisks just the right amount of oil to the moving parts; and a five-speed transmission gets the power of the motor briskly to the rear wheel.


A double-loop cradle frame with hydraulic suspension front and rear ensures tight handling, while the strong, elegant cast-alloy wheels add a final dash of

style to an enthusiast's machine.

A big 203mm hydraulic disc brake with rearmounted caliper provides superb stopping ability. Carefully placed controls; full instrumentation, including tachometer; and a well-balanced riding position make for rider comfort and safety.







Engine

The RD50M is powered by a 49cm³ two-stroke engine with a 6.8: 1 compression ratio and a bore and stroke of 40 x 39.7mm. The spark plug is centrally located and induction is by a 16mm Mikuni carburettor.

Yamaha's Autolube system, which feeds oil under pressure to the crankcase in relation to engine speed, ensures optimum lubrication under all working conditions.

Torque Induction fuel control utilises a system of steel reed valves which allows the passage of precisely the amount of fuel required by the engine. Smooth carburation and good throttle response at low engine speeds make the RD50M particularly effective in town riding and allow it to pull briskly away on the open road.
